He rose to international acclaim by winning the prestigious Montreux Jazz Guitar Competition in 2009, chaired by Lee Ritenour, and the Six String Theory Competition in Los Angeles in 2016.

Biography & career

- Roland began playing guitar at the age of six, taught by his father in a self-taught manner.
- At sixteen, he received a special prize at the Szolnok Jazz Guitar Competition, encouraged by Hungarian jazz legend Gyula Babos.
- He studied at the Kőbánya Music Studio under the mentorship of Ferenc Tornóczky and Gyula Babos, graduating with a diploma in 2007.
- In 2009, he won the Voice&Guitar competition in Völklingen.
- His debut album *Twins Effect* was released in 2010 through Gramy Records and distributed internationally by GLM Records.
- In 2012, his song *Szerelemre ébredt*, ("Awakened by Love"), performed with his band Finucci Bros Quartet, won the Jazzy Radio's Jazzy Song Contest competing alongside prominent artists of the Hungarian music scene.
- . This led to their 2013 album *Kész Regény*, a smooth jazz release acclaimed for its artistry and originality.
