- In addition to his teaching responsibilities, he has frequently been invited by the Ministry of Education to serve on national professional juries and as chair of final and qualification examinations.
- Among his ongoing duties is the supervision of various methodological studies, and he was once invited to prepare a publication \*The Methodology of the Cello\*, published by Zeneműkiadó in 2000.
